Report on the Audit of Standalone Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of **M/S. RNFI FINTECH PRIVATE LIMITED** ("the Company"), which comprise the balance sheet as at March 31, 2021, and the Statement of Profit and Loss and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Our Opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

Key audit matters

Key audit matters are those matters that, in our professional judgment, were of most significance in our audit of the financial statements of the current period. These matters were addressed in the context of our audit of the financial statements as a whole, and in forming our opinion thereon, and we do not provide a separate opinion on these matters.

Key Audit Matters are not applicable to the Company as it is an unlisted company.

Information other than the financial statements and auditors' report thereon

The Company's board of directors is responsible for the preparation of the other information. The other information comprises the information included in the Board's Report including Annexures to Board's Report, Business Responsibility Report but does not include the financial statements and our auditor's report thereon.

Financial Year 2020 - 21

BACKGROUND

RNFI Fintech Pvt. Ltd. was incorporated on 17.06.2019 as a Private Limited Company under the Companies Act, 2013.

The principal activity of the company is to carry on the business of financial and non-financial advisory, digital payments, prepaid cards, electronic wallets, pre-loaded cards, value added cards as principal or as an agent subject to provisions of RBI Regulations.

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

a) **BASIS OF PREPARATION**

The financial statements are prepared and presented under the historical cost convention on the accrual basis of accounting and in accordance with the provisions of Companies Act,2013, and the accounting standards prescribed in the Companies (Accounting Standard) Rules, 2014.

b) **USE OF ESTIMATES**

The preparation of financial statement requires estimates and assumptions to be made that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and reported amount of revenues and expenses during reporting period. Differences between the actual results and estimates are recognized in the period in which the results are known/materialized.

c) **REVENUE RECOGNITION**

- i. Revenue is recognized only when it is reasonably certain.
- ii. Other Income is accounted on accrual basis.
- iii.Dividend income is recognized when the Company's right to receive is established.

d) FIXED ASSETS

During the year company has not acquired any Fixed Assets and Depreciation has not been charged as no Fixed Assets are held during the year.

e) **DEPRECIAITION**

The Company follows the written down value method for depreciating its Fixed Assets. Depreciation on fixed assets is provided on written down value method and based on useful life of the assets as prescribed in Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013.

f) IMPAIRMENT OF ASSETS

An asset is treated as impaired when the carrying cost of asset exceeds its recoverable value. An impairment loss is charged to the Statement of Profit and Loss in the year in which an asset is identified as impaired. The impairment loss recognised in prior accounting period is reversed if there has been a change in the estimate of recoverable amount.

q) INVESTMENT

Long Term investments are valued at cost of acquisition and related expenses, unless, the diminution in the value of each of such investments in the opinion of the management is other than temporary.

h) **RETIREMENT BENEFITS**

The company does not have any employees other the Directors' hence there is no retirement benefit to be accounted for.

i) EXPENDITURE ACCOUNTING

Expenditure is accounted on accrual basis.

j) PROVISION FOR CURRENT & DEFERRED TAX

Provision for current tax is made after taking into consideration benefits admissible under the provisions of the Income-tax Act, 1961.

Deferred Tax is measured based on the tax rates and the tax laws enacted at the balance sheet date. Deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that there is reasonable certainty that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which such deferred tax assets can be realised.

The carry amount of deferred assets is reviewed at each balance sheet date. The Company writes down the carrying amount of a deferred tax asset to the extent that it is no longer reasonable certain or virtually certain, as the case may be, that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which deferred tax asset can be realised. Any such write-down is reversed to the extent that it becomes reasonably certain or virtually certain, as the case may be, that sufficient future taxable income will be available.

k) PROVISIONS AND CONTINGENT LIABILITIES

Provisions are recognized in the accounts in respect of present probable obligations, the amount of which can be reliably estimated.

Contingent liabilities are disclosed in respect of possible obligations that arise from past events but their existence is confirmed by the occurrence or non occurrence of one or more uncertain future events not wholly within the control of the company.
